	Peter thanked ACOSS CEO Dr Cassandra Goldie on behalf of the Board and ACOSS' members and spoke to the realities of the past year, including the pandemic, the new Federal Government and the number of Federal Budgets handed down over the period. He also thanked all the ACOSS Board Directors for	
	their time on this Board and the impact they have had. He shared that he is inspired by the work of the sector, this organisation and this team to end poverty and inequality.	
	Resolution: That the members receive the 2021-22 Annual Report.	Carried by majority show of hands
6	Treasurer's and Auditor's Report ACOSS Treasurer Matt Gardiner thanked Savannah for her gracious Welcome to Country and Angela for her generosity in sharing with us today.	
	Matt reported that ACOSS had operated sustainably over the 2021-22 financial year, resulting in a healthy balance sheet with reserves slightly above the minimum buffer required and a small surplus, which is about sustainability.	
	He noted that a number of multi-year funding agreements had come to an end in the period, but that the team had done extraordinarily well to replace this funding (through strategic business development activities) to sustain the important work that ACOSS does, while also implementing a number of cost-saving measures.	
	Matt asked the members to receive the Treasurer's Report and appoint the Auditor's Reports for 2021-22.

	Matt concluded by thanking Peter as President, the ACOSS team and Purpose Accounting for making the Treasurer's role so easy.	
7	CEO's Report ACOSS CEO Cassandra Goldie thanked Savannah for her Welcome to Country, acknowledged Country, thanked Angela Finch for sharing her story, as well as for her direct advocacy work, and thanked all attendees, the ACOSS staff team and ACOSS President Peter McNamara for his ongoing support. She expressed gratitude for the engagement of members, noting that those in attendance were not required to attend.	



She shared that ACOSS, along with many others, is gearing up to do what we can to deliver on the Uluru Statement from the Heart and ensure that self-determination for First Nations people becomes a reality.

She further noted that it had been a difficult year, both for people directly affected and service providers, and spoke to the pandemic and what's happening with the economy and cost of living, including the dramatic increases in the costs of housing and energy bills.

Cassandra acknowledged the work of ACOSS' national membership, noting that she looks forward to continuing to listen to members' advice on how we can bring forward the advocacy that will bring about the changes we are here to make.

She also thanked the COSS network, including Emma Campbell, CEO of ACTCOSS, and Deborah Di Natale, CEO of NTCOSS, who are stepping out of their roles; the SILA program; the ACOSS team for their commitment to the hard work that contributes to the change process, especially Edwina MacDonald for her work as Acting CEO during Cassandra's SILA-supported sabbatical and Amy Simmons for helping to drive and build organisational sustainability; the ACOSS Board, particularly Hayden Patterson, for the insights he brings from the communities he represents.

Cassandra shared that President Peter McNamara has concluded his term and was stepping off the ACOSS Board after almost a decade, including for the last three years as Board President. She noted that while Peter is warm, humble and funny, he is also sharp and holds people to account. She spoke to the many ways that Peter has contributed to the sector and to individuals, including by bringing in resources, insights and capability. She asked those in attendance to join her in celebrating Peter's contribution and shared that ACOSS is hugely grateful for everything Peter has delivered.

Cassandra shared a short slide show as a way to say thank you to Peter. She then closed and paused for questions and comments, of which there were none.

7 Returning Officer's Report and Election Results

ACOSS President Peter McNamara thanked Peter Sutherland for his exceptional support and long service as ACOSS Returning Officer and recommended that Peter Sutherland be appointed Returning Officer for the financial year 2022-23.

ACOSS Returning Officer Peter Sutherland began by acknowledging country. He shared that he was moved by

	ACOSS President Peter McNamara congratulated Mary, Violet and Hang, who have been appointed for three-year terms, and noted the experience they bring to the Board He acknowledged Hayden Patterson, as outgoing Board member, for the time he takes to listen to and advocate on behalf of others while sharing his own lived experience and thanked him for his friendship.
