



Climate Conversation Guide

Talking about climate change and social justice in your
community organisation





Your climate conversation can be as long or short as suits you and your colleagues. We've included suggested timings for a 45-minute conversation below.

Invitation email

Hi everyone,

The Australian Council of Social Service is running a Climate Change and Social Justice Awareness Week 16-23 August to promote conversations about why acting on climate change matters for the community sector.

We know that the communities we work with are being disproportionately impacted by climate change and that action needs to center their voices and experiences.

Would you join me for a 30 minute morning tea to talk about how engaging with and taking action on climate change is relevant to our organisation and the communities we work with? No prior knowledge necessary - this is an opportunity to explore these issues together and think about how we can engage with them.

Conversation Structure

Introduction [5 minutes]

Share why you wanted to talk to your colleagues about climate change. You may want to mention ACOSS' Climate Change and Social Justice Campaign focussed on raising the voices of the community sector on climate change and a recent example of climate change impacts.

Discussion [10 minutes]

What do you think about when you hear the words 'climate change'?

What's one way that climate change has impacted the communities we work with?

Sharing a climate story [5 minutes]

Choose a story from ACOSS' ['Community Climate Action Stories'](#) that is relevant to the work your organisation does. Share three things you found interesting from the story. You may focus on motivations for acting, initiatives or suggestions for future action, depending on what is most useful for where your organisation is in its climate journey.

Climate story discussion [10 minutes]

Ask participants to discuss how the experiences of the organisation profiled in the climate story link with your organisation's experience. Some things to consider include:

- How does climate change impact the ability to achieve organisational objectives
- How does climate change impact on the communities you work with
- How does climate change impact on your own service delivery
- Initiatives that can tackle climate change and benefit the communities you work with
- Initiatives that can tackle climate change and benefit your organisation

Our own climate story [10 minutes]

Ask participants to complete the sentence 'Action on climate change matters to the communities we work with because...'. You can do this as a group or ask participants to write down their own responses and share them with the group. Make sure to note down these responses.

Next steps [5 minutes]

Discuss what steps your organisation can take to engage with climate change. These may include:

- Sign up to the ACOSS Climate Change and [Social Justice Campaign Mailing List](#) to keep up to date with advocacy activities and policy development.
- Support more staff sign up to become Climate Change and Social Justice Champions.
- Share content on social media about why action on climate change matters to the communities you work with. This can be your own story about how the communities you work with are being impacted by climate change or a repost of relevant content from ACOSS or your State COSS
- Put a statement on your website about why action on climate change matters to the communities you work with
- Attending a climate-related talk or event
- Capture climate change impacts in your research and reporting
- Incorporate climate mitigation and resilience policies in your organisation's policy development and advocacy.
- Collect stories of climate impacts from the communities you work with
- Join the advocacy push for #RapidAndJustAction on climate as part of ACOSS Advocacy week 4-10 October
- Join a sector-specific or local climate action network (see the list below)
